Position description:

The Education and Outreach Program Coordinator will help us meet the diverse and evolving educational needs of our networks. This may include developing training tools, awareness campaigns and other educational programs. This position is supported by and reports to the Education Portfolio.

Position responsibilities:

- Assisting in building and updating current SFCC anti-violence training tools and programs.
- Co-presenting educational workshops and webinars.
- Identifying promising practices and emerging topics in anti-violence training.
- Connecting with SFCC network partners about training and education opportunities.
- Identifying potential partnership or networking opportunities to promote SFCC anti-violence training tools and programs.
- Represent and act according to organizational mission and values.
- Participate in weekly meetings with the supervisor and other team members.
- Participate in monthly full-team meetings.
- Other duties as assigned.

Desired skills:

- Experience with collaborative team tools like Google Suite, Slack, and Asana.
- Experience developing online/virtual educational and training tools.
- Experience with public speaking, delivery of educational materials, and/or workshop facilitation.
- Knowledge of and experience with anti-oppressive and intersectional approaches to learning, training, and support.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a dynamic team.
- English is required. French is an asset.
- Experience working with a nonprofit or grassroots organisation is an asset.
- Experience working with anti-sexual violence, anti-gender based violence, or student issues is an asset.

This position is funded by the Canada Summer Jobs program, which encourages mentorship and skill development under the Youth Employment and Skills Strategy. While the skills listed above are important to carry out the duties of the position, there will be opportunities for professional development to boost capabilities in certain skill areas.
