Position description:

Research Assistants will play key roles in supporting the many projects SFCC has on the go including but not limited to the Open Secrets Project, Advocacy Toolkits, building a forthcoming review of policies across the country. This position will work within and between all three portfolios of the organisation. This position is funded by the Canada Summer Jobs Program.

Position responsibilities:

- Supporting work on SFCC projects which may include reading and writing reviews of relevant literature, copy editing, writing duties, and discussing key issues related to projects.
- Connecting with other student groups and organisations doing anti-violence research.
- Supporting and/or facilitating presentations related to SFCC research and projects.
- Represent and act according to organisational mission and values.
- Participate in weekly meetings with the supervisor and other team members.
- Participate in monthly full-team meetings.
- Other duties as assigned.

Desired skills:

- Critical reading and analysis with an anti-oppressive and gender-based lens.
- Experience presenting complex and sensitive information in thoughtful ways.
- Strong written communication skills. English required, French is an asset.
- Experience with collaborative team tools like Google Suite, Slack, and Asana.
- Experience working with a nonprofit or grassroots organisation is an asset.
- Experience working with anti-sexual violence, anti-gender based violence, or student issues is an asset.

This position is funded by the Canada Summer Jobs program, which encourages mentorship and skill development under the Youth Employment and Skills Strategy. While the skills listed above are important to carry out the duties of the position, there will be opportunities for professional development to boost capabilities in certain skill areas.
